Figure out transport before you go. Share taxi numbers or public transport options. Have a plan B. Remember to never drink and drive.



Brush up on your workplace policies around responsible serving of alcohol, behaviour expectations (e.g. sexual harassment) and complaints.



Use a buddy system to make sure no one is ever alone or vulnerable. If you see someone who looks uncomfortable, step in, or check if they are okay.



Be smart about how much you drink, protect your drink, and keep hydrated with water.



Trust your instincts. Politely but firmly decline activities you do not feel comfortable joining in, like car rides, after parties and shots.



If something happens that makes you feel uncomfortable, seek out support and make a report to stop it happening to someone else.
